

ALDERMAN BOLTON PRIMARY ACADEMY

Oversubscription criteria for Alderman Bolton Primary Academy

Looked after children	Looked after children (often known as in care or LAC) or children who were previously looked after (PLAC) outside of England.
Siblings	Pupils with elder brothers or sisters already attending the preferred school and expected to continue at the school in the following school year. This includes full, half or step brothers and sisters and foster brothers and sisters who are living at the same address as part of the same family unit.
Advice from medical practitioner	Pupils for whom advice from a medical practitioner or psychologist has been provided by the parents/carers at the time of application in support of admission to a particular school, which, in the council's view, justifies admission to the preferred school. The council, if it is considered appropriate, will seek the views of the school medical officer or educational psychologist in the event of parents requesting admission on medical or psychological grounds.
Distance	Pupils living nearest to the school measured as a direct distance from the child's permanent place of residence to the school measured using a Geographical Information Address Point System based on the Local Land and Property Gazetteer. This measures straight line (direct) distances from the address point of the permanent place of residence to the address point of the school.

A tie breaker must be applied to decide which applicant will be offered the last place at a school when two or more applicants cannot otherwise be separated.

In the event of the direct distances (in miles) being the same for two or more applicants and the last place to be allocated would be to one of these applicants, the measurements would be taken again in kilometres and the place will be offered to the applicant living nearest to the school in kilometres.

In the event that the distances measured in kilometres are the same, a random allocation will be applied.

BEAMONT PRIMARY ACADEMY

Siblings	Pupils with elder brothers or sisters already attending the preferred school and expected to continue at the school in the following school year. Advice from medical practitioner	Pupils for whom advice from a medical practitioner or psychologist has been provided by the parents/carers at the time of application in support of admission to a particular school, which, in the council's view, justifies admission to the preferred school. BRUCHE PRIMARY ACADEMY

Nursery	Children who attend Bruche Primary School Nursery
Advice from medical practitioner	Pupils for whom advice from a medical practitioner or psychologist has been provided by the parents/carers at the time of application in support of admission to a particular school, which, in the council's view, justifies admission to the preferred school. The council, if it is considered appropriate, will seek the views of the school medical officer or educational psychologist in the event of parents requesting admission on medical or psychological grounds.
Distance	Pupils living nearest to the school measured as a direct distance from the child's permanent place of residence to the school measured using a Geographical Information Address Point System based on the Local Land and Property Gazetteer. This measures straight line (direct) distances from the address point of the permanent place of residence to the address point of the school.

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In the event that the distances measured in kilometres are the same, a random allocation will be applied.

DITTON PRIMARY ACADEMY

Oversubscription criteria for Ditton Primary Academy

Children in Public Care	Looked after children (often known as in care or LAC) or children who were previously looked after (PLAC), but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence or special guardianship order. This includes children who appear to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted (IAPLAC)
Siblings	Pupils with elder brothers or sisters, including half brothers and sisters, and unrelated children living together as part of the same household, already attending the school and expected to continue at the school in the following year
Distance	Pupils living nearest to the school defined as a straight-line measurement from the unique reference point of the child's permanent residence to the unique reference point of the school

In the instance of a tie regarding distance for the last place to be offered (to two decimal places in metres), a place will be offered using the electronic admission system's random allocation function.

EVELYN STREET PRIMARY ACADEMY

Oversubscription criteria for Evelyn Street Primary Academy

Looked after children	Looked after children and previously looked after children including those previously in state care outside of England
Siblings	Pupils with elder brothers or sisters already attending the preferred school and expected to continue at the school in the following school year. This includes full, half or step brothers and sisters and foster brothers and sisters who are living at the same address as part of the same family unit.
Nursery	Children who attend Evelyn Street Primary Academy
Advice from medical practitioner	Pupils for whom advice from a medical practitioner or psychologist has been provided by the parents/carers at the time of application in support of admission to a particular school, which, in the council's view, justifies admission to the preferred school. The council, if it is considered appropriate, will seek the views of the school medical officer or educational psychologist in the event of parents requesting admission on medical or psychological grounds.
Distance	Pupils living nearest to the school measured as a direct distance from the child's permanent place of residence to the school measured using a Geographical Information Address Point System based on the Local Land and Property Gazetteer. This measures straight line (direct) distances from the address point of the permanent place of residence to the address point of the school.

FRODSHAM PRIMARY ACADEMY

Oversubscription criteria for Frodsham Primary Academy

Looked after children	A 'Looked After Child' or a child who was previously looked after by an English Local Authority but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order). A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).
Previously looked after children	A 'Looked After Child' or a child who was previously looked after outside England but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order).
Siblings	Pupils with elder brothers or sisters, step-brothers or step-sisters, half-brothers or half-sisters, adopted brothers or adopted sisters living together as part of one household, already attending the preferred school (in years Reception through to Year 5).
Children within the catchment zone	Children are classed as 'in area' (resident in the school's catchment area) for a primary school under the Council's admission arrangements if they and their parents/carers are resident in the area served by the school on the closing date for applications.
Children attending a partner school	Children not resident within a school's local catchment zone but attending a school designated as a partner school for admissions purposes, as out-of-zone pupils (not applicable for Reception applications).
Distance	Pupils living closest to the school. Distance will be measured in a straight line from the centrally plotted Basic Land and Property Unit point (BLPU) of the child's home address to the centrally plotted BLPU point of the school as defined by Local Land and Property Gazetteer (LLPG).

All applicants within each criterion will be put into a distance order with priority being given to those that live nearest to the school.

(a) Catchment Areas Children are classed as 'in area' (resident in the school's catchment area) for a primary school under the Council's admission arrangements if they and their parents/carers are resident in the area served by the school on the closing date for applications. You can obtain information on which school serves your address by viewing 'Catchment Areas' at www.cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk/admissions or alternatively by contacting the Authority on

0300 123 7039. The law will not allow any authority to guarantee places at the catchment area school. Neither can places be reserved.

(b) Where it is identified that there are a limited number of places available and the Local Authority cannot differentiate between the applications using the nearest school criterion (criterion 6) a random allocation tie-breaker will be applied. This may be required for example, where applicants reside in the same block of flats.

KINGSWAY PRIMARY ACADEMY
